



New 3 day JR Kyushu rail pass

On 15 July JR Kyushu will introduce a 3 day pass for use on all JR railway lines in Kyushu including the Tsubame bullet train. The 3 day pass is the newest addition to JR Kyushu's selection of rail passes for overseas visitors, which currently includes a 5 day Rail Pass, and 3,5 and 7 day Jet Ferry + Rail Passes. Kyushu's famous sightseeing destinations such as Beppu hot spring resort, Aso in Kumamoto Prefecture, Nagasaki and Kagoshima can be accessed by JR making the JR Kyushu rail pass an ideal way to travel around the island.

Rail Passes: 3 day rail pass 13,000 yen
5 day rail pass 16,000 yen
*Children 6-11 half price

Sales: JR Kyushu Rail Pass exchange orders are available outside of Japan from Japan Airlines, ANA, Jalpak, JTB, Nippon Travel Agency, Kinki Nippon Tourist, Toptour Corp.

The JR Kyushu Rail Pass is sold in Japan to overseas visitors who entered Japan on a temporary visitor visa. The following documents must be shown:

1. Passport issued by a country other than Japan;
2. Embarkation/Debarcation Card (ED Card) for leaving Japan;
3. Return trip air ticket for a destination outside Japan. Ticket sales are limited to visitors with a return trip ticket.

Sales are limited to one rail pass per person per trip to Japan.

5 day pass 27,000 yen
7 day pass 30,000 yen
*Children 6-11 half price
(above prices are effective from July 15)

* Jet Ferry + Rail Passes include a round trip ticket from Korea (to Kyushu) on the Kobee or Beetle jet ferries, unlimited travel on JR Kyushu trains and on the Asoyufu Kogen bus.

The Jet Ferry + Rail Pass exchange voucher is not available for purchase in Japan. It can be purchased only in Korea from Korea Marine Express.
